ENGLISH GRADE: 3 Unit 1

(NO. 3/4)

Day 3

Learning outcomes

To enable the students to learn about:

- ✓ Recognize naming words as nouns.
- ✓ Demonstrate use of some nouns (from immediate and extended environment)
- ✓ Recognize general naming words as common nouns and particular naming words a proper noun.
- ✓ Classify nouns as common and proper nouns.
- ✓ Use capitalization according to the rules learnt earlier.
- ✓ Recognize and apply capitalization to the initial letter of proper noun: days of week and month of the year.

Lesson Structure

Time	Introduction	Teaching Approach
5-10 minutes	The teacher will explain the concepts of Common, Proper, Possessive noun and Capitalization.	Teacher Based: The teacher will introduce the topics cover in the lesson.

Time	Main Content	Teaching Approach
15-20 minutes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The students will be asked to name some famous-specific places, things and persons to tell them they are proper noun. ✓ Common noun will be easy to identify then. ✓ Definitions of possessive noun will be explained given on page # 12. ✓ Then, she will explain the rules of capitalization. ✓ First letter of specific person, place, thing, nationality and language would be capital. ✓ Put full stop after completing the sentence. ✓ Teacher will write any sentence on the board to explain the concept clearly. ✓ Beena lives in England. 	Interactive approach: The students will be asked to recall the concept of naming words.

Time	Conclusion	Teaching approach
5-10	Teacher will recap the topics taught during lesson.	Student Based: The students will be encouraged to practice possessive nouns and capitalization on board.
